—VERY PECULIAR.—The Summerside Journal says: The horse and wagon, the property of M. Leckey, Tignish, that disappeared so mysteriously from the Alberton tea grounds some three weeks ago, was recovered on Saturday last under such peculiar circumstances that it remains an open question whether the horse was taken by some mischief-loving person or persons, driven for some time, then turned loose on the road after the reins were securely fastened in the turret ring, or whether he became unhitched at the tea grounds and wandered off home on his own accord. The animal was found stuck in the mud in a swamp back of Mr. Leckey's house where he had evidently wandered, and judging from the decomposed state of the carcase, he died some time before from starvation.

—SET OF FALSE TEETH FOUND BELONGING TO ATKINSON.

SYDNEY, Aug. 26.—The only new developments in the Atkinson case consist in the finding of a set of false teeth, and a copy of the JULY (first half) number of the Popular Magazine near where the body was discovered. The teeth so far as the dentist who supplied Mr. Atkinson with a set can tell, are not those which belonged to the dead man. The magazine has a name written on it, but only a few letters are legible. The name ends in "son."

A story is current today of a man who resided here some years ago, and who is said to have threatened Mr. Atkinson's life. It is reported that the man was in the city at the time the alleged crime was committed, but nothing definite has been learned about this so far.

—CONCLUDE WAGE DISPUTE: WITH 45,000 RAILROAD MEN.

CHICAGO, Aug. 26.—Danger of a strike affecting the 45,000 trainmen of the Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad was averted today. Points at issue will be decided by an arbitration committee of eight men to be appointed within fifteen days. This was announced tonight by W. D. Chembre, United States commissioner of mediation, who has been here since Friday bringing all railroad officials and representatives of the workmen together.
