**SACRED EDIFICES CLOSED IN LONDON**

LONDON, March 1.—The Bishop of London proposes to close all but eight churches in the City of London until the end of the war. The object is to set the clergymen free to act as chaplains with the forces on active service, or in volunteer work under the national service scheme. The City of London has many churches and few inhabitants. According to the census of 1911 the resident population was 19,657. The churches are a survival of the time when merchants and tradesmen lived on their business premises. Before the great fire in 1666 there were 90 parishes. Of the churches destroyed 36 were not rebuilt. In the last century 25 churches were taken down and the sites of the old ones divided among the famous churches. St. Ethelburga, Bishopsgate, has 74 and is one of the oldest it escaped the great fire. St. Stephen, Walbrook which is considered one of the finest examples of Wren's work, and St. Martin Bow in Cheapside which now hangs to 151 and the bells which are the successors to the traditional Bow bells associated with Dick Whittington. St. Giles, Cripplegate, has 652. This is where Milton is buried.

Senor Vasquez, however, has solved the difficulty. No matter at what time one visits his studio the king can be seen there sitting in a familiar pose in the uniform of a colonel of infantry.

**IMPOSSIBLE TO KEEP U. S. NAVAL SECRETS.**

WASHINGTON, Feb. 28.—As a result of the controversy which the navy department held with Charles Curtis, concerning the wisdom of using the electric drive in the new battle cruisers. Rear Admiral Griffin, chief of the bureau of steam engineering, has charged that it is impossible for the navy to keep secrets, because American shipbuilding companies divulged the contents of the plans given to them for estimate purposes.
