SHORT COURSE DAIRY SCHOOL.

THE GUARDIAN had a visit yesterday from Mr. Robert Jenkins, Secretary, and Mr. Fraser T. Morrow, Inspector of the P. E. Island Dairying Association in the interest of establishing a dairy school of instruction. As is well known Ontario has a permanent school of dairying at Kingston and New Brunswick has one at Sussex. What is proposed for P. E. Island is a short course, say two weeks of lectures and practical instruction in dairying to be held in March or the latter part of February just before the annual meeting of the Association. The matter will be brought before the Directors of the Dairy Association at their next meeting 6th September.

Mr. J. A. Ruddick, Chief of the Dairy Division at Ottawa proposed the matter on his recent visit to the Island. He said the Department would send an instructor to conduct the school, and he himself was coming to attend the Dairy Association's annual meeting and would attend the close of the course. It would be necessary to locate the school in some place where there are all the facilities and appliances for dairy work and a full supply of milk at that season of the year. There will be no difficulty on this score.

We trust that the Dairying Association will take the matter up and have the proposed school put in operation. It ought to do much to promote practical knowledge in the line of factory work. The time proposed for the course will be at a period when many of the factory managers will have leisure to attend, the school will enable them to obtain in their own Province information and instruction for which in former years many found it necessary to go abroad. We believe the proposal will meet with general favor among our dairymen and we hope to see it carried into effect in the new year.

The Winnipeg Free Press affirms that the Roblin government between January 22, 1900 and February 26, 1901 dismissed 108 persons from office in Manitoba and have since largely added to the number, and adds that "the present Manitoba Government possesses the worst record even held for vindictive partisanship in the civil service."

The Newfoundland Government have invited Sir Wilfrid Laurier to visit that Island in October to confer with them in regard to greater security for ships in passing their coasts. Five ocean steamers with their cargoes, representing a value of a million dollars have been wrecked this season on the Cape Race promontory. All vessels passing in or out of the Gulf of St. Lawrence across the Atlantic when the Straits of Bellisle are closed by ice must pass this dangerous coast as near as may be. The Straits of Bellisle are also dangerous, and nearly a score of steamers have been wrecked there within ten years past. The Dominion Government is pushing forward this season a telegraph wire along Labrador to Chateau Point and thence laying a cable to Bellisle itself. Newfoundland is in treaty with Marconi for the introduction of his system. It is hoped that these and other measures may reduce the present very great dangers of the Newfoundland coast.

CHAMPION SWIMMER.

LONDON, 24.—The race for the quarter-mile salt water swimming championship of England off Worthington to-day was won by D. Billington, who covered the distance in 8 minutes 20 1/2 seconds.

It is quite surprising to read in the Boston Herald that an order has recently been issued by the authorities of the Lehigh Valley Railway prohibiting the use of any other language than English by employees of the road while on duty. The order adds that "in no case shall Pennsylvania German be spoken". The order arose from a conductor having given directions in the foreign language which, being misunderstood, very nearly resulted in a serious collision. The Herald adds that the language known as Pennsylvania German is a combination of Bavarian and English and is spoken commonly by at least two million people in Pennsylvania. It is said not to be dying out.

TURKISH ARMY IS BORDERING ON ANARCHY.

CONSTANTINOPLE, August 24.—Owing to the arrears in pay, the Turkish army is in a state bordering on anarchy, and a number of violent acts on the part of the soldiers have been reported. The garrison at Adrianople threatened to burn the governor's house and hold him captive unless the money matters were settled. The Porte sent a courier to pay the men, and trouble was averted there.

PALACE CAR FOR ROYAL PARTY.

NEW YORK, Aug. 24.—The palace car Sandringham built at Dayton, Ohio, under an order from the Intercolonial Railroad for the use of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall and York on their trip through Canada has been shipped to Halifax. The interior work is in mahogany, holly and light oak.

DEMAND RE-ORGANIZATION.

COLOGNE, August 25.—The Gazette, which is a semi-official organ, publishes a sensational article to-day concerning the case of a soldier who shot an officer at Gumbinnen. The paper demands the re-organization of the German officers corps and the dismissal of those officers who through extravagant smartness smother all the spirits of the soldiers. The Gazette says this action should be taken regardless of high family connections or the military record of the offending officers.

SECRETS DESTROYED.

LONDON, August 22.—Truth says that the late Dowager Empress Frederick recently destroyed her journals and correspondence with Queen Victoria to prevent leakages of such state secrets as were contained therein.
