N. Y. Stock Market Ends Losing Week With New Nosedive

NEW YORK, May 18 —(AP)—The stock market Saturday emerged from its heaviest losing week since last September with a further nosedive to a new average low for better than two years on the broadest and most active Saturday dealings in fifteen months.

As in the Friday relapse, the preceding downward sessions, selling was attributed mainly to a growing apprehension regarding a possible substantial business recession later in 1947.

Saturday's losses, running to two or more points, were shaded here and there at the close by a little short covering and bargain-buying and a handful of pivots managed to show modest advances.

The Associated Press 60-stock composite was off 3/8 of a point at 58.5, a low since Jan. 25, 1945. It was the widest Saturday dip since last Jan. 11.

Casualties for the day included Allied Chemical, off three at 106; Norfolk and Western 4 3-4 at 220; Chrysler 2 1-2 at 92 1-2, Santa Fe 2 3-8 at 70 1-8, Youngstown Sheet and Tube at 54 1-2, Douglas Aircraft 2 1-8 at 50, Johns-Manville two at 109 and U. S. Gypsum 2 3-4 at 57 3-4.

Others on the retreat were U.S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Bond Stores, Glenn Martin, Lockheed, Sperry, American Telephone, American Water Works, Anaconda, Kennecott, Dow Chemical, N. Y. Central, Southern Railway, Standard Oil (NJ), Schenley, American Tobacco "B" and International Paper.

Home State Mining was 1/4 at 45 and Eastman Kodak 1/4 at 44. Small advances were shown by United Cigar Wheelan, Oliver Corporation and American Can.

McIntyre closed up 1-4 among Canadian issues while Canadian Pacific and Distillers Seagram each lost 1-4. Dome Mines was unchanged. Canadian curb issues were quiet.

Tight Situation In U. S. Steel Supply

CLEVELAND, May 18 —(AP)—A tight supply situation persists in steel products, despite record-breaking peacetime shipments from the mills, the magazine Steel said today in its market summary.

"Consumer pressure for finished steel products continues unabated, being especially urgent in sheets and strip, plates and merchant pipe," it said.

The overall supply picture "is expected to remain tight over the remainder of this year, particularly in sheets and strip," continued the report. "Some important easing in supply of bars, shapes and nails is likely as current record-breaking peacetime output gradually fills inventory pipelines."

The publication also noted that "no backing up in the steel supply is yet seen as a result of consumer resistance to prices in hard consumer goods lines." It added that "talk of early change in steel prices had disappeared."

The national steelmaking rate "recovered sharply last week from the effects of labor troubles," the magazine's index rising 2 1-2 per cent to 94.5 per cent of rated capacity.

Jewish Immigrant Ship Intercepted

JERUSALEM, May 18 —(Reuters)—The Jewish immigrant ship Trade Winds, reported to be carrying 1,500 uncertificated Jews, berthed in Haifa harbor Saturday night under British naval escort as unconfirmed Tel Aviv reports said a second ship, carrying 4,000 Jews, was nearing Palestine.

Four "ferry" ships stood by to transport the immigrants to Cyprus, to be held there until they can enter Palestine under the quota.

The port area had been closed and security precautions were taken to prevent Jewish demonstrations around the harbor as the ship was brought in.
