JAMES KELLY

The late James Kelly, whose death was announced in the Guardian last Thursday, was in the enjoyment of his usual good health, till about nine months ago, when symptoms of an insidious disease appeared, to which, despite the best medical treatment and tender nursing, he succumbed at his home, Pownall Street, in this city, on the morning of Wednesday, the fourth instant. Deceased, in early life, taught school for several years, invariably winning the good will, esteem and lasting friendship of his parents and pupils in the districts in which he laboured. In 1893 he engaged in the grocery business, which he conducted on Queen Street, up to within a few weeks of his demise. The late Mr. Kelly was a man of quiet, unassuming disposition, truthful, temperate, and devotedly attached to his home and family. He was a true friend, kind neighbour, and good citizen, conscientiously fulfilling his duties in every relation of life, and his early passing away in the fiftieth year of his age, will be deeply regretted by his many friends in the city and province.
