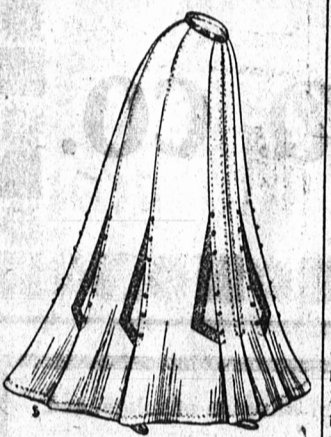

## THAT NEW PLATEAU SHAPE.

The flat plateau shapes have taken a new lease of fashionable favor, partly, no doubt, because they demand a certain amount of chic and style in their development, demanding both a clever designer and a clever trimmer. The one of the latter is a combination of straw and embroidered linen, the crown being of the latter, all hand-worked, with a border of straw in a dull faded rose tint that harmonizes well with the yellowish tint of the linen batiste that is employed. Quaint-looking little roses are deftly tucked in between the two rows of straw that edge the brim, and the back is folded over in envelope fashion, this edging motif twice repeated here. There is a bandeau in the back that extends in a narrowing line to the front, and gives the flat shape that fascinating tilt down over the forehead. The back is well built up, and covered with a perfect conservatory of the faded little roses, with little knots of velvet ribbon being tucked in here and there with the happiest effect.

## HARBIN THE PRIZE OYAMA IS SEEKING

Vladivostok Would Fall of its Own Weight Once Harbin is Taken.

LONDON, June 22.—With the near approach of another great battle which promises to result more disastrously to Russian arms than that of Mukden the internal situation is daily becoming more serious and threatening. The revolt in trans-Caucasia has grown to such alarming proportions that it has been necessary to send a large force of troops into the disturbed district from Baku and other large garrisons. An insurgent army numbering over thirty thousand men, crudely armed, is said to have taken the field against the government troops and are rapidly gaining recruits. In Lodi the spirit of revolt is rife as a result of the firing by the troops on a workmen's procession similar to that which marched under Father Gopin to the white palace on "bloody Sunday," twenty-two persons being killed and several hundred wounded. Workmen have begun a systematic sapping of the police and soldiers in revenge for this outrage. In the Far East General Linvitch is believed to be caught in a trap from which there is very little chance of escape. The Japanese are reported to have landed troops at Possit Bay with the object of marching to Ninguta where they can cut the railway and isolate Vladivostok, while still another flanking force, supposedly under command of General Nagai, who executed the famous flank movement at Mukden with Port Arthur veterans, is reported to be headed in the direction of Tsikakar, thus endangering Linvitch's communication with European Russia and making it necessary for him to fall back on Harbin if he is not headed off from the north, and the great Manchurian base captured before he has reached it.

The capture of Harbin is now the chief object of Oyama's campaign, according to British observers. A well known army man said to-day: "The situation in Manchuria is such now that there is no pressing necessity for Oyama to risk his troops in an active siege of Vladivostok. The place can no longer prove dangerous as a refuge for Russian ships. There are none fit to venture in the open sea except possibly two, and they are not likely to make the attempt. Once Harbin is taken Vladivostok will fall of its own weight and the capture of Harbin is probably not far off."
