PROSPERITY OF THE EMPIRE.

In so vast an Empire as that now ruled over by King Edward it would be unreasonable to expect that all sections should be equally prosperous. The exceptions at the present time are however limited in number and extent while the Empire at large is prospering as seldom if ever before. Australia has suffered severely from drought during the past year, but the cause is a temporary one and will in the natural order of things give place to better conditions. The British West Indies have suffered for a much longer period owing to the competition of bounty-aided beet sugar from Europe with the great staple of cane sugar produced in the islands. Here, too, the outlook is favorable, owing to the recent action of the continental sugar congress with regard to the gradual abolition of the bounty system, and a measure of direct aid promised by the British Government.

To these exceptions may be added the case of Ireland, where owing to the immemorial conflict between landlords and tenants, and the competition of cheap grain and farm products from America, the farming industry has been much depressed. But even with regard to Ireland we have the assurance of Lord George Hamilton recently made that "in a few months they would see a very material improvement in her condition." This assurance receives support from the speeches of the Lord Lieutenant, the Earl of Dudley, and by John E. Redmond, the acknowledged leader of the Irish party in the Commons. Mr. Redmond went so far as to say that the tenants were united, and that a moderate and quite limited use of the Imperial credit would enable a settlement of the land question to be brought about. Both he and the Lord Lieutenant spoke in the most cheerful tone of the prospect of bringing the landlords and tenants together. Behind this, it was pointed out by George Wyndham and Horace Plunkett, (Irish), lies an equally important movement for the reorganization and development of Irish agriculture along the line of co-operation, production and distribution by more modern and scientific methods. There is a new feeling of hope in Ireland, and it is much easier to deal with hopeful men than with men who are merely discontented and desperate. In the meantime general industrial conditions are improving and the savings banks show increasing deposits.

The larger Island of Great Britain, the heart and centre of the Kingdom, with 35 millions of population, is in a prosperous condition. The great coal strike in America has given increased demand and better prices for British coal: the trade returns are well sustained and the vast industrial population has seldom if ever had a fuller measure of employment at such good wages. Never before was so large a share of the world's commerce under the British flag and the receipts of British shipowners from the carrying trade of the world are adding constantly to the national wealth.

Canada is prospering as never before with her industries expanding and in full blast, her revenue showing by each quarterly return a constant succession of records broken; her trade still expanding by leaps and bounds, while an excellent harvest throughout the crop-producing Provinces gives assurance of increased trade and increased industrial development for the coming year. Never before was Canada's mineral production so great or so valuable, and never before was the outlook in all lines of industry, production and trade brighter than at

the present time. India has had a remarkably favorable year, and this is a matter of the greater importance from the fact that in our great eastern Empire nearly three fourths of the people over whom King Edward holds sway are located. The parliamentary correspondent of the London Telegraph, referring to Lord George Hamilton's speech on the Indian budget, says "India is prosperous and contented beyond record." Some figures cited brought into strong light the growing prosperity of that portion of the Empire. Notwithstanding during the last three years the expenditure of twenty million pounds upon railways, two million upon irrigation, and heavy contributions on account of the famine in Western India, there had been realized a surplus amounting to \$8,300,000. He had estimated the surplus of the current year at \$237,000. The year is now sufficiently advanced to enable him to state that the surplus will certainly not be less than £1,700,000.

In the year 1890-91 the external trade of India amounted to \$130,000,000, touching the high-water mark noted up to that date: Ten years later it was \$163,000,000. In 1890-91 the Indian railways had a mileage of 17,300, and a capital of \$151,000,000. In ten years these figures had grown to a mileage of 25,300, and a capital of \$235,000,000. It will thus be seen that progress goes hand in hand with prosperity in British India. It is most gratifying to note the conclusion resulting from a survey of conditions throughout the British family of nations, that never before was there such general content, coupled with increasing wealth and prosperity as in the current year.

THE CHARYBDIS' SAILS.

HALIFAX, Nov. 27.—The British war ship "Charybdis" sailed this afternoon under sealed orders. The impression prevails here that she has gone to Venezuela. The dockyard officials decline to give any information as to her destination.
