"Outside the churches, Rotary is the greatest living force in the world today," said George O. Spencer, District Governor for District 32. "It is a moving thing. It is growing at a tremendous rate, but in the opinion of W. L. Manier, the International President, it is not growing fast enough, and he is planning more extensions."

In the world there are fewer than 200,000 Rotarians, but they are scattered throughout 91 different countries, and during the past four years the clubs have been increasing at the rate of two and a half a day.
