I at once got friendly with him and he finally decided that I was a commercial traveller from St. John. We travelled on the same boat and train. I had Detective Jones of Amherst meet me at Moncton, and he also got acquainted with the would be sleuth, and became very much attached to him, so much so that he, on their arrival at Bathurst, stuck right to him. In the meantime I had wired Sheriff Doucette of Bathurst, to meet me on the arrival of the train, at the Revere Hotel. This he did and from the information we both had, we drove out fifteen miles to a railway camp, near the Glasgow Iron mines, and arrested Irving Lewis. When arrested he had a 32 calibre revolver, with all the chambers loaded. We brought him to Bathurst and lodged him in goal. When I got back to Bathurst, about three o'clock that morning, I found my friend Jones entertaining his newly made friend, the would be sleuth. It is needless to say that the cattle dealer was amazed to see me there, and at once realized that the jig was up. It is needless to say that Detective Jones and myself had our sport out of the fellow. We left on the Ocean Limited that morning and crossed on the boat Friday night, brought my man before Stipendiary Tweedy at Alberton, on Saturday and he was remanded until the 20th for preliminary hearing. He had confessed to all the brigandages except the Station affair, but admits that he planned this affair with McIntyre.

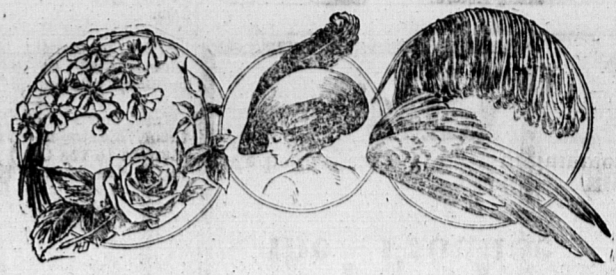
