cient to drive any self-respecting people to distraction. Of the many instances given to us, one is worthy of particular mention. It was of an assessor, a pronounced Liberal heeler, who offered his farm for sale last summer for which he was offered \$7,000 but reserved it for \$8,000. He assessed this for taxation purposes at \$2,000 whilst his neighbors, and especially Conservatives, were assessed in increased amounts varying from fifteen to thirty per cent.
