U. S. Pilot Killed When Plane Crashes On Ontario Farm

PARKHILL, Ont., March 5—Second Lieutenant N. A. Cowles of the United States Army Air Corps Reserve was killed Saturday night when his biplane crashed into a stable near here in fog and darkness. The \$2,000 Severisky pursuit ship plummeted into the building, killing two horses and a cow and flew to bits. The scene of the crash, the farm of Jack Young, is 30 miles north of London. The body of the 23-year-old pilot was found badly broken, about 60 feet from the stable. The plane was scattered in small pieces over two adjoining fields. Two guns from the machine were hurled a quarter of a mile away. Cowles, who was flying from Boston to Selbridge Field near Detroit, is survived by his widow and a child at Mount Clemens, Mich. The body was taken to Selbridge Field where officers from Selbridge Field where Cowles was stationed about a year on transfer from Randolph Field in Texas. The pilot's parents live at Tacoma, Wash.

offers to assist a limited number of fishermen from the Maritime Provinces to attend the **SHORT COURSE FOR FISHERMEN** to be given at the Atlantic Fisheries Experimental Station, Halifax, N. S., during a term of three weeks commencing on April 11th, 1939. Each course will cost \$20.00. Each course will be given on completion of the course the sum of Twenty-one Dollars plus the amount of railway fare for a return trip between Halifax and the railway station nearest his home. Only bona fide fishermen from 15 to 35 years of age who have passed through grade 6 in the public schools of the Maritime Provinces or an equivalent grade will be able to obtain these grants.
