THE QUESTION OF MARITIME UNION.

In connection with the meeting of the Maritime Board of Trade in this City the Halifax Herald devotes a leading article to the question of Maritime Union, in which the reasons in favor of such union are outlined, and the leading objections thereto are briefly stated. That The Herald is in favor of union is sufficiently apparent from the head-lines placed above its article: "The Seaboard Provinces Can Only Remain a Factor in National Life by Maritime Union."

THE ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROHIBITORY LAW.

Some questions have arisen in connection with the procedure in recent trials under the prohibitory law in this city which have caused anxiety to those actively concerned with the enforcement of that important measure. It is natural enough that in litigation one party, or the other, or both should meet with disappointment, or supposed cause for complaint, in such cases. The layman usually does not understand the law as lawyers and judges do, and the judges and lawyers do not always agree in their interpretation of the statutes, or in matters of procedure.

Ex-President Elliott of Harvard in reply to a critic of his Religion of the Future, expresses the belief that he has been misunderstood.

HORSE NOTES.

Wednesday, July 27, the Gentlemen's Driving Club of Boston opened its matinee season at Readville track with two races. In class B, also a trot the victor was the four year old trotter Aquil, Betty Bush, driven by Mr Graves taking the initial heat in 2.30, after which Aquil won handily in 2.27 1/2, 2.23 1/2. Aquil is a fast mare, Johnny Quinn, trainer for Duamwold Farm, having worked her a half in 1.05 1/2, the last quarter in 32 seconds a 2.08 clip.

The second matinee of the Gentlemen's Driving Club of Boston held at Readville track on Wednesday, Aug. 3, furnished two or three close and exciting finishes. In one of the heats the first being Lexington (Charles Sanders) and Aquil (Arnold Lawson) the finish was so close that the Judges could not separate the horses and it was called a dead heat, the time of which was 2.17 1/2. Aquil won the next two heats and race in 2.19 and 2.18 1/2. Aquil is a very speedy four year old trotter compactly built, with rapid stroke, and she went at her work on Wednesday like a race-nag. It looks as though she would prove a very useful trotter for Mr Lawson, Aquil winner of the two races mentioned above is a half sister of the trotting stallion Aquiri owned by J. M. Nicholson, Charlottetown.
