

**U.S. Navy Needs a Deficiency Appropriation.**

It is probable the Navy department will be forced to ask for large deficiency appropriations during the next session of Congress. Already, with the fiscal year but one-fourth exhausted, the funds are woefully depleted, so much so that in some of the bureaus there is scant means for carrying on the regular work at navy yards and stations. Under the head of construction and repair, for which Congress allotted \$3,000,000, the bureau has already expended \$1,442,674, leaving a balance to carry the bureau through the nine months remaining of \$1,557,326. An inquiry is now being made to ascertain which vessels should be repaired first and which ships may without loss to the government await the deficiency appropriation. The present indications are that about \$10,000,000 will be asked for to help on the various naval projects.

There is a misunderstanding in most quarters in regard to the action of Secretary Long in limiting the repair work on ships of war. This does not mean a reduction of force nor a cutting down in the expenditures at yards and stations. The plan is to arrange the work so that with available funds the important projects shall be carried out first, leaving the yachts and unimportant ships for the deficiency appropriations. The regular amount will be expended this year and there will be no attempt to economise so long as the funds last. —Chicago Tribune.

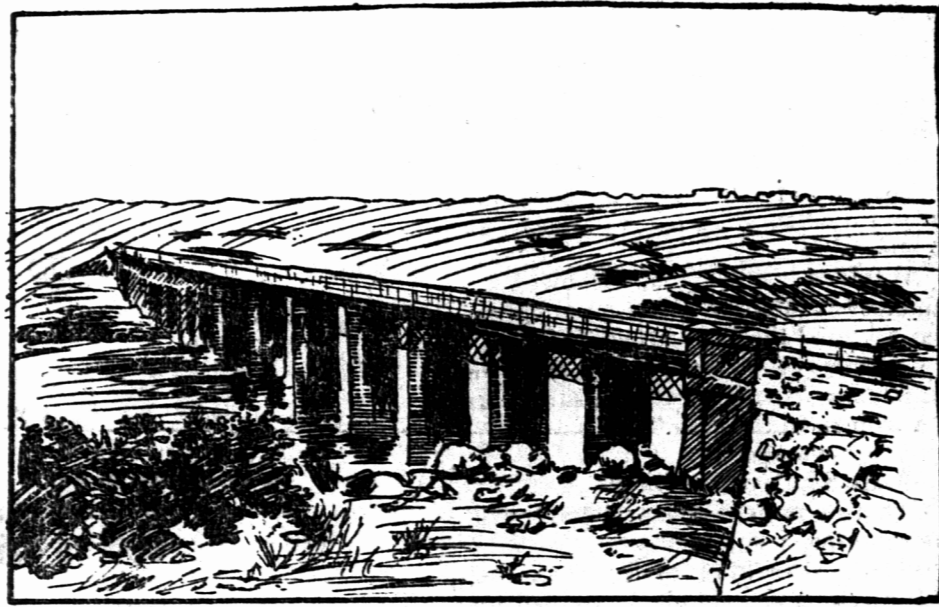

preparing and selecting at least equal samples could be sent from Cape Breton. It is time that our people would wake up and show to the rest of the province what can be produced. P. E. Island walks away with their prizes in cattle, sheep, etc., while Cape Breton shows no signs of energy and progress. Samples of grain are easily carried and do not suffer from long carriage and the same can be said of fish samples. Where were the barrels of salmon, mackerel, herring and alewives, the boxes of codfish, hake and pollock that should have been sent for prizes? Surely there is a lack of interest and well directed ambition among our farmers and fishermen that requires to be stirred up. The Frenchmen still use the good to drive the oxen and some influence is wanted to move our people along and make it known at an exhibition that good things are produced in Cape Breton, and shew what it can produce by land and sea. It is more than doubtful if yearly exhibitions can be carried on successfully and if one would be held in New Brunswick one year and another year one in P. E. Island then the third year in Nova Scotia, then the combined efforts of all the provinces would make it a success. But really there is too much sameness in annual exhibitions to call the number of visitors together to make it a financial success. The fish prizes this year were mean in the amount to be awarded and most stupidly arranged but this will be corrected before another exhibition takes place. Then let fishermen prepare their fish to show the rest of the province what fish can be produced and cured in Cape Breton. Should I ever get time, I would like to write one letter in the interest of Cape Breton fishermen.
