CARTIER'S PLEDGE TO GRANT'S GRANDSON ENTERS THE ARMY.

Chapman Grant, who is a direct descendant of General Ulysses S. Grant, has tendered his resignation as assistant curator of the Children's Museum of the Institute of Arts and Sciences, Brooklyn. He will report for duty as second lieutenant with the Fourteenth United States Cavalry on December 15. Mr. Grant will discontinue his connection with the museum on December 1 and will join his regiment in Texas, where it is doing duty along the Mexican border.

Mr. Grant is a son of Jesse R. Grant, youngest son of General U. S. Grant. His decision to enter the army, Mr. Grant asserted yesterday, was largely due to the belief that

war with Mexico was almost inevitable and to his desire to serve his country. It is recalled that his grandfather was twice brevetted for gallant conduct in the Mexican War in 1847.

The commission of Mr. Gallant is the fourth in the series that has included President Grant, Major General Frederick D. Grant and Captain Ulysses S. Grant, 3d, U.S.A., Major General Grant was an uncle of Chapman Grant and Captain U.S. Grant, 3d, is his cousin.

ANNUAL CHRISTMAS EXODUS FROM CANADA

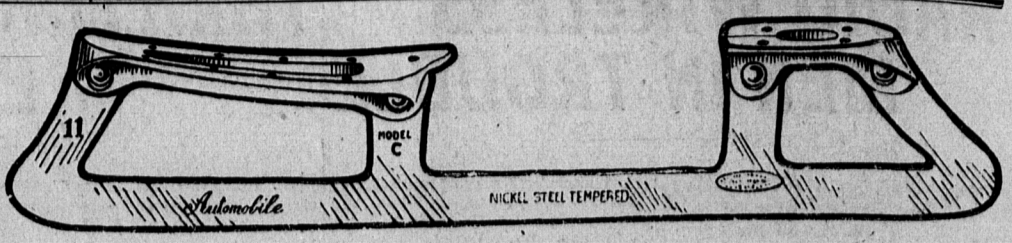
First of the Christmas steamers that annually convey thousands of passengers who have "made good" in Canada and who heed the call of the old land for the festive season, the White Star liner Canada sailed yesterday morning from Halifax for Liverpool with her entire accommodation filled. Something like fifteen hundred persons crowded aboard the Canada on the arrival of the last train-load on the previous evening and at that several hundred were turned away.

Promising to eclipse all records for passenger travel through Halifax, the annual Christmas exodus from Canada is now begun and so heavy have the bookings been that two steamers more than original calculations provided for have been commissioned to sail in the next fortnight, making a fleet of eight passenger liners to leave.

When reports of approaching trains from western Canada on Wednesday afternoon conveyed an idea, of the traffic bound this way it was decided to have the Allan line Scandinavian call here from Portland on Saturday to take the overflow. Next week the Donaldson steamer Letitia, of a line which is seldom seen in Halifax harbor, will come round specially from St. John to embark passengers for Glasgow.

On Saturday the Allan liner Virginian also sets out for Liverpool and the Megantic on Sunday. W. F. Spencer, passenger traffic manager of Furness, Withy and company, said
