Steps will be taken at once to secure the approval of the maritime synod and statements of the facts in the matter will be forwarded this morning to Rev. Dr. Falconer, of Pictou, chairman of the foreign mission committee. But it is already settled that Miss Robb will go. The brother, Rev. Alex. Robb, is in Korea by appointment of the Presbyterian church in Canada but there is work for two single women among the women and children at his station and there his sister will go. She will be much missed at St. David's, where she was very prominent worker in the Sunday school and Women's Foreign Missionary Society. At the prayer meeting last evening she addressed the meeting and related how she had been called to this work. Besides her brother in Korea, Miss Robb has two other brothers, both in Y. M. C. A. work. St. John Telegraph A. W. Robb the popular Y. M. C. A. Secretary here is Miss Robb's brother.
