Food Still Problem For British Women

LONDON, Sept. 17 - (CP) - Britain's most impatient question form at pushcart for purchases of leg beans, cherries, strawberries, rambling which men and women feel the disappointment of less food after victory in Europe.

But Britons are an uncomplaining breed. They took the cut, voiced their disappointment, and queued up for the luxury of ice cream and native-grown fruits. They felt better.

But Britons still eat the same tasteless sausages, heavily breaded hamburgers, dried beans and cabbage or Brussels sprouts, that formed their diet in the days of blackouts and air raids.

Neck Rot of Onions (Science Service News)

Neck rot is a serious disease of onion bulbs, appearing after they have been placed in storage.

It is caused by one or more species of fungi which produce a softening of the scales, beginning usually at the neck, more rarely at the base or at a wound. A gray felt-like growth later forms on the rotting scales, accompanied sometimes by black kernel-like bodies. The initial invasion of the onions usually takes place in the field when the tops have been broken down or after they are removed. The reason for this, says R. J. Ladingsham, Dominion Laboratory of Plant Pathology, Saskatoon, is that the causal fungi are weak parasites and do not actively attack a growing plant. The critical time, then, is confined to the curing or drying period. This process is important and it is essential that it be thorough; moreover, it is desirable that the onions should be stored in a well-ventilated place where the humidity is relatively low.

LADINO CLOVER (Experimental Farm News)

Ladino clover is comparatively a newcomer to Canadian agriculture. It was introduced from Europe during recent years and is rapidly gaining in popularity as a hay and pasture legume in eastern Canada, says Dr. T. M. Stevenson, Dominion Agricultural Station, Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa.

In appearance the Ladino variety is typical of the Dutch white and white wild clovers except that the plant is larger in all its parts. Stems are longer and stouter. The leaves are broader and the flower heads larger. Consequently when grown in mixture with timothy or other tall-growing grass, Ladino clover is all as alike or red clover. It grows well in areas where ordinary white clover is well adapted, and at the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, it has proved to be equal in hardiness to the better varieties of white wild clover.

Experiments conducted at the Dominion of Purgas Plants, Ottawa, show that while Ladino does not persist quite as well as white wild clover under cover, it is particularly valuable in hay-pasture mixtures. When it was used to replace alsike clover in the ordinary timothy red clover, alsike mixture, increases in yields from 15 to 26 per cent were recorded in both hay and pasture tests.

Double Train Service Ends On Sept. 29

MONCTON, N.B., Sept. 17 - The double through passenger train service between the mainland and Prince Edward Island operated daily except Sunday will be discontinued after Saturday, Sept. 29th next, according to an announcement from regional headquarters of the Canadian National Railways here.

Service from the mainland to Prince Edward Island on and after that date will be by train leaving Charlottetown at 6:30 P.M. (Summerside 6:10 P.M.)

From Prince Edward Island to the mainland service will be by train leaving Charlottetown at 6:45 A.M. daily except Sunday arriving in Moncton 10 P.M., where connections will be made for Montreal and points west. Also for Saint John and Boston.

Train leaving Sackville at 5:45 P.M. making connection with the Ocean Limited east bound for Charlottetown and train leaving Charlottetown at 10:30 A.M. daily except Sunday instead of 7:30 P.M. arriving in Summerside at 4:10 P.M.
