THREE GOVERNMENTS ARE INTERESTED.

ST. JOHN, April 9.—That the local governments in the Maritime Provinces will unite in taking up the matter of the establishment of an industrial college is about certain. Already negotiations are being carried on and a meeting of representatives will shortly take place. Judge Wallace of the Nova Scotia bar writes Rev. W. R. Robinson that the matter will be approached by the three governments at once.

Judge Forbes will secure information on the running of the colleges in Massachusetts and New York states on a visit which he will make shortly. Rev. Mr. Robinson is now in communication with the governors of Kansas and Illinois, where large industrial colleges are working most satisfactorily.

Mr. Robinson, who is convener of the special committee from the Moral and Social Reform Council, which is working in the matter, expressed himself yesterday as well pleased with the progress being made. He thought that three governments acting together would achieve fine results.

BABY BORN ON EXPRESS TRAIN.

MILLIONAIRE PAYS \$500,000 TO WIFE TO END DIVORCE SUITS

NEW YORK, April 9.—A cash payment of \$500,000 has put an end to the marital warfare of General Charles F. Miller, the multi-millionaire Standard Oil man, of Franklin, Pa., and his wife, Emma Bullen Miller, who until recently has been making her home in this city.

From a friend of the rich oil man and his pretty wife, it is learned that he has given her the half-million (which is about one-twentieth of his fortune) in consideration of her agreeing to live apart from him, to abandon the divorce action which she has been preparing for months and to relinquish all claims upon him.

Besides the \$500,000 Mrs. Miller also gets the assurance from the general that he will abandon his divorce suit against her, and never will institute another one.

Marion B. Dem, 4 No. 20 Broadway, who is Mrs. Miller's attorney and was preparing her divorce action against the general, declined to affirm or deny the story of the fortune transfer.

"I cannot disclose the settlement of this case or discuss any of its features," he said, "other than to say that it is closed so far as I am concerned."

The \$500,000 was handed to Mrs. Miller in a hotel in this city by a Pennsylvania man who is a friend both of Mrs. Miller's and of the general's. Soon after receiving it she went west.

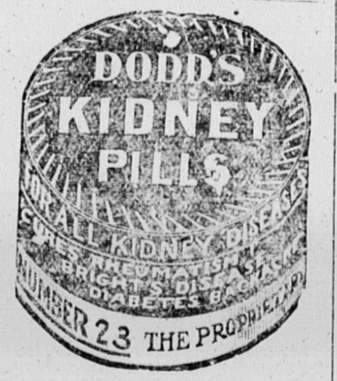
