HORSE RACES AT NEW GLASGOW

Charlottetown was represented by five racers, three of which succeeded in capturing first money and one third which was a very creditable showing for the first race of the season.

In the 2.25 pace Derby won the first two heats very handsly, but the result of the race looked bad for the Charlottetown pacer when Nellie Lea won the third and fourth heats. In the final heat the mare broke on the back stretch and the heat was captured by Baron Britt, which gave Derby first money.

Oakley H and Jellico both proved too fast for trotters for their opponents by capturing the last three heats in their respective races.


