FARM NOTES

GRADES FOR CAULIFLOWER RECOMMENDED BY THE FRUIT BRANCH, DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

No. 1 shall consist of neatly trimmed compact heads of cauliflower which are not discolored, ricey, fuzzy or over mature; which are free from damage caused by dirt or other foreign matter, bruises, insects, disease, mechanical or other means. Attached leaves shall be fresh and green.

No. 2 shall consist of heads of cauliflower which are free from serious damage caused by overmaturity, discoloration, dirt, or other foreign matter, bruises, disease, insects or mechanical or other means.

In order to allow for variations incident to proper grading and handling in each of the above grades, not more than 10% of any lot by count may be below the requirements of the grade, but not to exceed one half of this tolerance shall be allowed for any one defect.

No. 3 shall consist of heads of cauliflower which do not meet the requirements of the foregoing grades.

Definition of Terms

"Compact" means that the flower clusters are closely united and the heads feel solid.

"Discoloration" means that the head is of some abnormal color.

"Ricey" means that the stems of the flower clusters have started to elongate, causing the clusters to separate and give the head a loose or open and sometimes a granular appearance.

"Fuzzy" means that the stems of the individual flower buds throughout the head have begun to elongate, giving the surface of the head a velvety or hairy appearance.

"Overmature" means a stage of growth which is beyond that of a compact, properly developed head. An overmature head is loose, ricey, or fuzzy.

"Free from damage" means that the head is not injured to an extent readily apparent upon examination.

"Free from serious damage" means that any injury from the causes mentioned does not affect the edible quality of the head.
