U. S. DRY ENFORCEMENT COSTS \$43,000,000

WASHINGTON, Dec. 1.—The prohibition enforcement budget for the fiscal year 1927-1928, in the rough, will be \$33,000,000. This includes the money for the Dry Unit and the Coast Guard, but does not include approximately \$10,000,000 extra allowance required by the Department of Justice because of additional duties on account of the Volstead Act. The high cost of prohibition has mounted from \$7,000,000 in 1920 to \$43,000,000 plus for 1927. It is estimated by Senator King of Utah that 250,000 persons receiving an average of \$2,000 a year, or a total of \$500,000,000, are employed by the Government to enforce prohibition.
