THE SUMMER SCHOOL OF SCIENCE.

We are sure that all readers of The Guardian who have read the reports of the different sessions of the Summer School of Science, now convened in this City, will admit that the teachers who are attending the School are doing so at some sacrifice of their vacation time and of their personal inclination towards other forms of diversion. For it is a proverb that all work and no play is not good for anyone, and though a superficial observer might think that these educators are having a sort of holiday gathering, that opinion would be quickly changed on closer examination. It is pardonable to express a doubt whether any other body of people engaged in the world's important work show on the whole greater devotion to duty than school-teachers. For the soldiers, sailors, doctors, lawyers, politicians, inventors, and the masters of industry there is glory, celebrity, and fame, if they steer clear of graft—but what reward falls to our school-teachers after lives of painstaking labor. Poorly remunerated; often not appreciated, both by those ignorant of the exactions of their employments and those who know better; in many cases snubbed and neglected by others who should work hand in hand with them in the grand work in which they are engaged, we may be allowed to refer to them as showing an admirable devotion to their calling by giving up the pleasanter attractions of holiday time to imbibe more knowledge at the fount of the Summer School. None show a finer appreciation of the moral claims of their profession imposed upon them or a nobler regard for the faithful performance of the same. What happens often in other classes of industry where workers are faced to face with the conditions which surround our teachers? Retaliation,—strikes! But, reader, did you ever hear of teachers striking. Never as a body—though the writer has warm and tingling remembrance of an Irish schoolmaster who individually left nothing to be wished for under this head. The Guardian heartily commends all the teachers—visitors and residents—who are here attending the Summer School and disseminating as well as imbibing valuable knowledge. They generously offer the public the privilege of attending and learning with them. May the school enjoy continued success in its worthy work, and may all disabilities disappear from the teachers' paths in this Province at least, so that the road to learning may be made easier and more attractive for them to follow.

ALL THAT IS DONE WITH PARAFFIN

Wonderful Paraffin. Paraffin was at first a useless by-product of the oil refineries, but now a thousand uses. Besides the use of paraffin for candles, 2,000,000 blocks of refined paraffin are sold every year for an infinity of purposes. A liberal arrangement with a chewing gum maker gave him the foundation for a million dollar fortune. Paraffin was applied to Cleopatra's needle in Central park, New York, when the surface of the obelisk began to scale off, and it stopped it. Stone fronts of houses are protected the same way, an application every three or four years being sufficient to prevent disintegration. Paraffin is made into colored crayons, which will stick on glass as well as paper. Paraffin is used in laundries to whiten the clothes and in polishing the surface of starched pieces. It is used for sealing canned fruits or anything put up in bottles by home folks, manufacturers, druggists or chemists. It is used generally as a substitute for beeswax, tallow and sealing wax and for insulating wires.

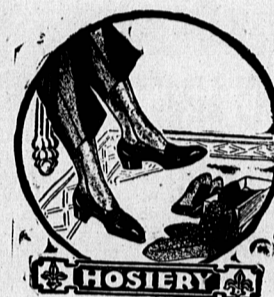

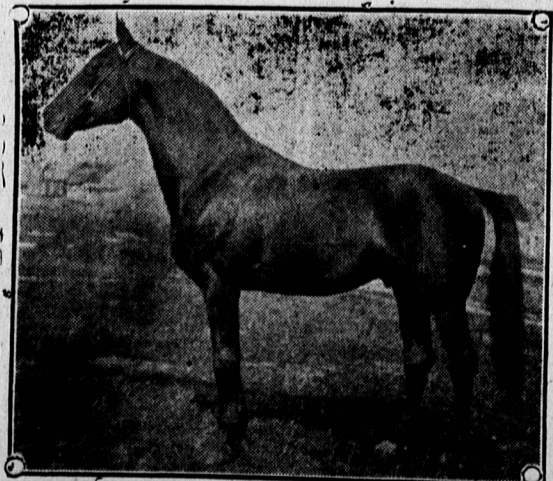
