## Church Sinking in a mine.

Hazleton, Pa., Sept. 21.—St. Patrick's Church at Audenried is slowly sinking into the mines, and abandonment of the property will be necessary. For the last ten hours the ground has been settling and the southern wing of the church is almost entirely torn away, the main building being supported only by two badly twisted pillars. Father Malloy ordered the removal of everything from the church this morning. The cause of the cave-in is a sudden rush of coal in a gangway running beneath four large pillars of coal in a breast directly under the building. The church is valued at \$8,000.
