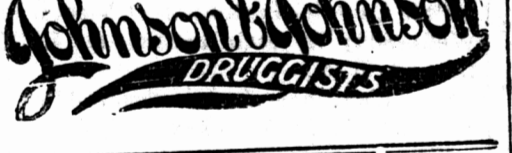
How He Failed.
