CONSERVATIVES IN COUNCIL.

Leader Borden the other day called together in Montreal the Conservatives Senators, Members and Editors for a mutual council. Not much has transpired as to the result of the conference but it is to be hoped it may serve some useful purpose.

Mr. Borden is himself, a worthy and patriotic man but he has made some mistakes, has missed favorable opportunities of attack, has failed to evolve any distinctive policy on which to appeal to the country and is generally too smooth and non-aggressive.

There are those who defend or excuse Mr. Borden for accepting a salary as there are those who defend the iniquitous salary grab, but none the less the Opposition leader is distinctly weaker before the country because of his acceptance of a salary.

And by so much his chances of leading his party into power are blighted. With that feature we are in no way concerned but we are concerned that we have an Opposition under Mr. Borden, which is largely paralysed from effecting the legitimate work and office of an Opposition and so contributing by its criticism and its resistance to give the country better administration.

The federal Opposition has fallen upon evil days and in our opinion it can only be extricated from its present powerless and ineffective condition by first shaking itself clear of the entanglements which now paralyse its action, by then adopting a more aggressive line of action and shaping a platform and policy which will appeal to the country as a present policy of simple negation can never do.

It is almost regrettable to think that already the longest day of the year is past and the sun is on his journey southward again. Saturday was a delightful day for a sail across the Straits or up West River, just warm enough and not too warm on the water, and the green shores are now almost at their best.

The Emerson Croquet suit for original libel seems likely to go over till September. Behind the action for criminal libel are other suits entered by Mr. Emerson for civil damages against the Fredericton Gleaner, the Halifax Herald and the Toronto World. If all these suits go forward there will be extended litigation in three Provinces over this unpleasant affair.

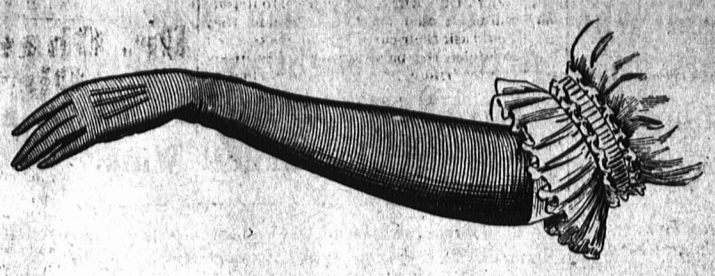
