Ordinary Revenue Shows Decrease

OTTAWA, Jan. 15.—Total ordinary revenue of the Dominion Government in the first nine months of the present fiscal year totalled \$332,371,205 compared with \$420,427,116 in the corresponding period of the previous fiscal year, according to figures released tonight by the comptroller of the treasury. Special receipts brought the grand total to \$394,821,748 against \$402,261,545.

FRANCE CONCERNED OVER VICTORIES OF SPANISH INSURGENTS

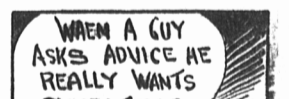
