

Abegweit Intermediates Beat Joggins 2-1

Wait N'See Wins Feature Event At Covehead Saturday

Chalking up his second pacing victory of the season veteran campaigner Wait N'See, owned by George Gregory and again well driven by Len O'Meara Saturday afternoon captured the feature event of the Covehead harness race meeting when he headed a field of four other entries in all the heat, winning by a margin of two comparatively easy and then staving off Bright Spot's stretch bid in a stretch duel in the third mile.

Witnessed by only a small crowd of fans and with a heavy wind blowing down the times chalked up the fans nevertheless again witnessed racing of the highest order as Maude Budlong came through with a four heat victory in the No. 2 Classified, Bonnie Dale, Willard Kelly's improving trotter won the No. 1 Classified and Billy Conn came from behind in all three heats to capture the No. 4 Classified, final event on the program.

Fastest time of the meeting was trotted up by Wait N'See who paced his first two miles in 2:13.

The officials in charge again came through with a splendid performance with Starter Dr. F. C. Dougan, not having to contend with delays due to broken harness, etc., getting the 13-heat card off in quick order with scoring being held to a minimum.

No. 1 Classified
In last place going up the backstretch the first time around Wait N'See started to move up coming into the stretch; he took over the lead at the first turn and from there on made over a comfortable margin as Bright Spot and O. U. Volo waged a stirring duel for second spot with the former getting the nod; Bonnie Dale was fourth and Lorraine Abbe fifth.

Second Heat: The lead shifted rapidly after Starter Dougan sent the way to the backstretch had been reached Bright Spot, Lorraine Abbe and Bonnie Dale had had turns at leading. But again Wait N'See came from behind and once he had taken over the other four couldn't match his pacing, with Bright Spot in a drive to the wire nipping second place, and O. U. Volo was fourth and Lorraine Abbe in that order.

Third Heat: Wait N'See made his move early in the first heat, and paced from behind in the three eighth pole to go to the front and stay there although in the stretch dual Bright Spot, improving with each heat, closed rapidly on him, but a half length back with the remaining three finishing in the same order as they did in the two previous miles.

No. 2 Classified
It was the best race of the day. In the first heat Buddy Budlong taking the pole at the first turn was never leading in the seven eighth pole to go to the front and stay there although in the stretch dual Bright Spot, improving with each heat, closed rapidly on him, but a half length back with the remaining three finishing in the same order as they did in the two previous miles.

Fourth Heat: Buddy Budlong took back at the quarter pole after the smart return made in the backstretch and waited until they hit the three quarters before starting their drives. Flashing by the seven eighth pole to go to the front and stay there although in the stretch dual Bright Spot, improving with each heat, closed rapidly on him, but a half length back with the remaining three finishing in the same order as they did in the two previous miles.
