The schooner Helen M. Maximer, Capt. Maximer, left Summerside Monday for Yarmouth. As she would be in the shelter of the island during the run down the straits, it is thought that she would escape damage during the gale Monday night.

ARCH MCKELVIE, car inspector at Summerside, had a close call Monday, when uncoupling the car trucks of No. 1 train on the wharf. He had finished uncoupling one and was under the car uncoupling another, when the train moved ahead. He succeeded in throwing himself between the wheels and escaped unhurt. It would appear as if more caution should be exercised by rain men.

The crew of the Empress brought word yesterday afternoon that a wrecked schooner was seen at Herring Point, South Shore. The name of the schooner could not be ascertained. This schooner turned out to be the Malabar referred to in another paragraph. The Captain and crew although they suffered from cold and exposure, are all safe and at latest accounts last night were making their way to Summerside, by Centerville. The schooner was driven ashore at 4 o'clock yesterday morning. Further particulars will be given tomorrow.

A good deal of uneasiness is felt regarding the safety of the schooner Malabar. Capt. John Read, bound from Mal Bay Quebec, for Summerside in ballast. The schooner was in Mal Bay Saturday and having but a small cargo to discharge there, it is feared that she started on the home ward voyage. It is so she would encounter Sunday gales and the still fiercer gale of Monday night. There is no telegraphic communication with Mal Bay, hence the uncertainty of the schooner's movements. She carried besides the Captain, a crew of five men viz:—Alex Gallant (Shediac) Summerside; two Murry Brothers, Bedouque; a son of the late Captain D. Roche who was recently drowned at Alberton, and a young man from Richmond Co. C. B.
