(Canadian Press) TORONTO, April 24—Silver intrusted Toronto mining market patrons today as metal and shares rolled upward to new highs, the metal to its best price in 10 years and the leading stocks to their 1935 tops.

The latest advance of the world price of silver to a higher level than the U. S. domestic price brought in heavy buying during the morning session, but prices were only mildly buoyant. From a close Tuesday at 1.89, Eldorado did not break through \$2 until the afternoon and gains for the others were limited to two or three cents.
