THE KINGDOM DIVIDED.

GOLDEN TEXT.

I. Kings 12: 6-16.

"He that walketh with wise men shall be wise; but a companion to fools shall be destroyed."—Prov. 13' 30.

POINTED SUGGESTIONS.

No series of lessons could be presented at this time which would not be received with a sense of disappointment. There is no climax in revelation comparable to the story of Jesus, who, being the effulgence of God's glory, and the very image of His substance, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when he had made purification of sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high."

Having enjoyed and profited by the privilege of so great a study during recent months, a measurable anticlimax must be suffered as our attention is directed to another series of lessons. But as Jesus is the consummation of revelation, let the mind and heart be awake and alert to behold Him in its historic unfolding.

The series begun today is by no means uninteresting or without immense moral and spiritual value. If the greatest study of mankind is man, the opportunity is at hand. Shakespeare's marvelous analysis and reproduction of human character may be studied from the originals from week to week. Whatever were his historic sources or his concrete examples, he could have had none better than those who shall come into view in the study of "The Kingdom Divided."

There are those like Rehoboam, who seek counsel with no intention of taking or acting upon it unless it shall meet their desires and ambitions. Beware of the counsel of the wily parasite who gives that which is desired rather than that which is needed. A companion of fools shall be destroyed.

It is generally possible to hear what you want to hear. Gossip obtains all its strength of stinging resource because of the falsity. But gossip is usually very tame that is not born of a lie. Matter-of-fact men, whose counsels are the expression of their truth-telling experience and wise outlook, cannot present a case with sufficient smack in it to suit the frivolous and vain-hearted.

Why did not Rehoboam pray? Why did he not go to the All-wise if he felt the need of guidance? Why did he not listen to the "I ought" within his soul, and seek to measure up to it, rather than seek counsel at all from those whose words were sure to conflict? Though forty-one years of age, he fails to show good sense.

Pride of possession is often seen to be in inverse proportion to the cost of securing, while despotism measures its power by exaction. Get-rich-quick people are often offensive for that reason, and their tyrannous combines and corrupt trusts hasten revolutions.

The failure of those who have the privilege, and who ought to do good, creates the opportunity of the bad. See whose name appears. It is none other than Jeroboam, the son of Nebat, who made Israel to sin.

Jeroboam had been told that he should be a ruler. David, it is to be remembered, was anointed to that end. But what a huge diameter of difference there is between the procedure of the one from that of the other. David waited the Lord's time. Jeroboam thought God was too slow. Are there more D's than J's, or otherwise?

The teaching of Jesus that was so frequently before us of late is that greatness means service. In the light of Rehoboam's folly and its consequences, let the truth that Jesus teaches be written larger.

Public Notice

As measles seem to be getting prevalent in the schools of Charlottetown owing to the neglect of some citizens, public notice is called to the Regulations of the Board of Health, especially to Rules 1 and 6.

Rule 1 states that any household in whose house occurs a case of measles shall immediately notify the Board of Health, through its Health Officer or secretary, of the same.

Rule 6 states that no member of any household where measles exists shall be permitted to mingle with children in schools, churches, or other public places.

There is a penalty of \$40.00 for failure to obey the rules.

The Board of Health requests all citizens to comply with the regulations at once, and assist in stamping out the disease.

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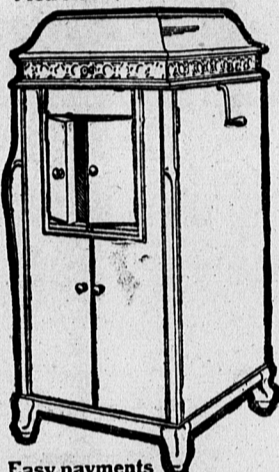

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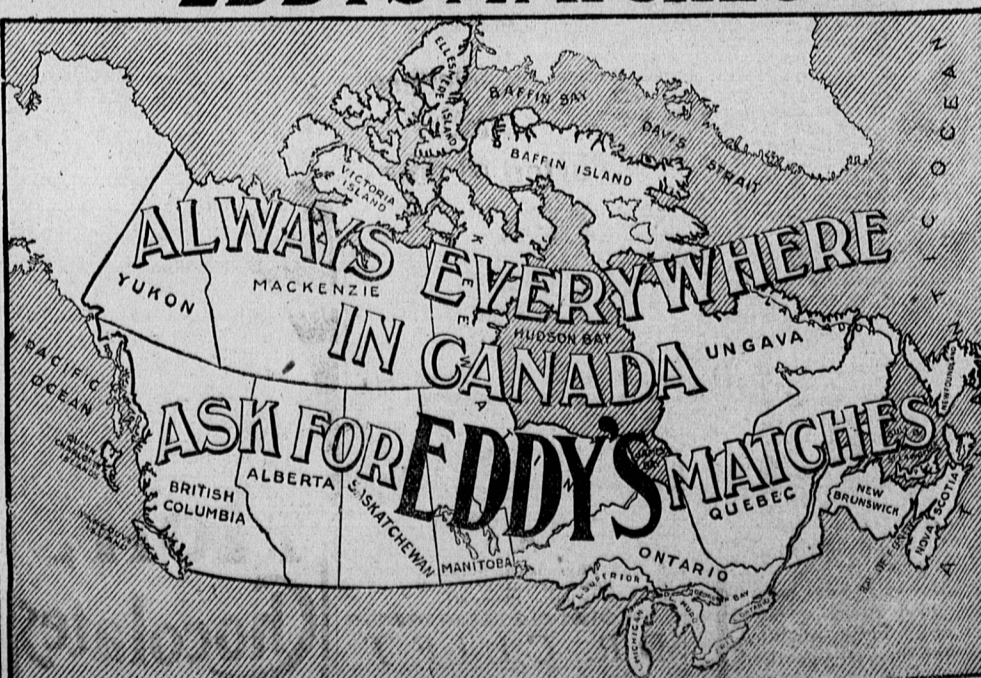
