Installation Of New Private Wire

Due to the increasing activity of the markets, and finding it impossible to give service without a private wire, Johnson and Ward yesterday installed a direct wire to Montreal, Toronto, New York, and other financial centres. This wire will give the public as efficient service as is obtainable in the financial centres themselves. As an example it is pointed out that orders for one hundred shares or more have been transmitted over this wire to New York, and the report of purchase or sale has been received three minutes from the time it was sent from Charlottetown.

Johnson and Ward are the only members of a stock exchange in Prince Edward Island and are the only ones giving quotation service to the public.

The system used is the teletype, which presents the characters on a tape, similar to the ticker service in New York and Montreal.

It is confidently expected that the firm will have every success in the new move.

Visits Old Home After 57 Years

Mr. James Methrall, of Wallaston, Mass., arrived in Summerside on Monday evening on a visit to his old home in Cape Wolfe. Mr. Methrall left his native province in 1886 and had not been home since.
