A SPLENDID FEAT—The ship Wallen Abbey, from Port Arthur, Texas, arrived in London on April 3rd. It is said in London to be the only big sailing ship that ever sailed through the channel gate spanning Dover, Calais, France without tug or pilot. Capt. Macdonald got the bearings of the gate from the Scout Boats while the submarines lurked around and did not wait but sailed through and in to the Downs, where he was met by a tug boat dock her. THE PLAY THAT WILL BE HISTORIC—Charlottetown will have an opportunity tomorrow and Friday of witnessing a play in the Prince Edward Theatre that is likely to be historic—one of the dramas that never die, but are constantly reproduced year after year all over the world. This play is "The White Feather," an exciting, absorbing drama dealing with the German spy system and the counter operations of the British Secret Service. The drama, while treating of incidents connected with the struggle in Europe, portrays none of the gruesome and harrowing happenings at the front, its scenes being set entirely in one room of a private hotel on the East Coast of England. Its main episodes, if presented on the stage two or three years ago, would have excited just a tolerant smile from the majority, just as did "An Englishman's Home," but the revelations of the widespread net of German espionage which have reached the public since August of 1914, show that the authors have had to exercise their inventive faculties but little in constructing the framework of their drama. So far from being a pot-boiler, designed to take advantage of the prevailing interest in all things pertaining to the great war, "The White Feather" is a well knit, cohesive and interesting drama, and it is likely to be found in the category of plays slated for revival years after the war has ended, just as Gillette's "Secret Service" retains the power to thrill and entertain twenty years after it was written and fifty years after the conclusion of the internecine war on which it was based. Incidentally the play contains a mild hint to those estimable citizens, themselves in no danger of being called upon for service, who would clap into kind every apparently eligible man they see. It is not often Charlottetown has been provided with an opportunity of seeing and enjoying the production of a play with an international reputation, and there should in consequence be bumper houses both tomorrow and Friday night.

MARITIME EXPRESS BADLY WRECKED

MONCTON, May 8.—About 1 o'clock, Sunday morning while running at the usual brisk rate of speed, No. 3, north-bound maritime express, locomotive 445, in charge of Conductor A. Davison, and Engineer William Hicks, both of Moncton, was ditched a short distance east of Red Pine, a small flag station on the main line of the I. C. R. about 77 miles this side of Campbellton. The box mall express, second class and baggage cars left the track and piled up in the ditch, while the forward trucks of the first class car were also down on the ties. The locomotive, diner and two sleepers remained on the rails. The express car almost immediately took fire and was completely destroyed. The wreck was one of the worst, which has overtaken an I. C. R. passenger train for some time, but fortunately no one was killed or even painfully injured.
