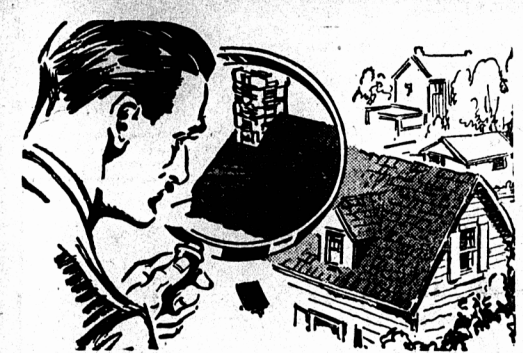
This War—Four
Years Ago

MAY 26, 1941—The fleeing German battleship Bismarck was hit by an aerial torpedo from a British plane. Prime Minister Ramsay MacDonald told his parliament he had made strong representations to Britain against the extension of conscription to Northern Ireland.

MAY 27, 1941—German battleship Bismarck was sunk 400 miles west of Brest by British naval and air forces with loss of probably 2,300 lives. The navy also pursued the Nazi cruiser Prinz Eugen. President Roosevelt proclaimed an unlimited national emergency in the United States.
