The opening of these Cancer Diagnostic Clinics in Charlottetown and Summerside is a major step in the fight against cancer in this Province.

Therapy Treatment "Our educational programme so far has brought a big increase in the number of people seeking treatment for cancer. In 1946, there was an increase of 50 per cent over the previous year and last year again there was a further increase of 25 per cent, over 1946.

"Everybody must help to fight cancer because no one is immune to the dread disease. Large numbers of those doomed to die of cancer in the next 12 months can be saved if their symptoms are recognized and treated in their early stages."

Early Treatment "The major objective of the Canadian Cancer Society is to persuade men and women to seek treatment at the first sign of cancer symptoms without delay."

"We owe a special vote of thanks to the members of the Women's Institutes throughout the Province as well as to the members of the Prince Edward Island Teachers Federation and other bodies."

"The government of Prince Edward Island is to be commended for an active interest in cancer control and the grant made to establish Diagnostic Clinics is one of the finest things they have ever done for the Public Health of this Province."

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND SCALE OF AMUSEMENT ACT

Approved by the Lieutenant-Governor-in-Council on the 20th day of May, 1948, under authority of "The Amusement Tax Act."

TO TAKE EFFECT ON MAY 24th, 1948. A Tax is payable by all persons attending a place of amusement as follows:

- On a price of admission of 12 cents or under, a tax of 3 cents
On a price of admission from 13 cents to 16 cents, inclusive, a tax of 4 cents
On a price of admission from 17 cents to 20 cents, inclusive, a tax of 6 cents
On a price of admission from 21 cents to 27 cents, inclusive, a tax of 8 cents
On a price of admission from 28 cents to 30 cents, inclusive, a tax of 9 cents
On a price of admission from 31 cents to 35 cents, inclusive, a tax of 10 cents
On a price of admission from 36 cents to 40 cents, inclusive, a tax of 11 cents
On a price of admission from 41 cents to 49 cents, inclusive, a tax of 12 cents
On a price of admission from 50 cents to 74 cents, inclusive, a tax of 15 cents
On a price of admission from 75 cents to \$1.00, inclusive, a tax of 25 cents
On a price of admission over \$1.00, a tax of 35 cents

Persons admitted by "Pass" or "Complimentary Ticket" must pay tax on the maximum price of admission at the performance attended.
