Athletes Gather For Empire Games Trials

TORONTO, July 14 — (CP) — Canadian track and field athletes began arriving here today for the British Empire Games trials Friday and Saturday. An estimated 180 men and women will compete. Ontario's more than 100 entrants tops the list.
An over-all Canadian team of 62 for the games in New Zealand next Feb. 4-11 is tentatively mentioned.
Jack Davies of Montreal, honorary secretary of Canada's B. E. Games Association, said in an interview here he "had no idea" how many would be chosen. "It all depends on finances, and right now we're not doing so well. "We are getting money from some points in Canada, but a national effort is necessary. As it is now, it is too localized."
Davies said he "hoped" to receive a grant from the Dominion Government and "things were looking up in this direction, but the Dominion election in June interfered and now Finance Minister Abbott is in London." The Finance Minister "holds the purse strings, and his okay probably is necessary."
Prince Edward Island's lone entry—David Boswell of Victoria who is entered in the 440-yard dash, has not arrived for the trials as yet.
