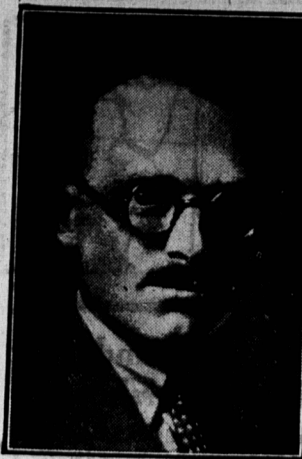

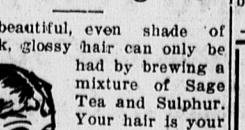
P. E. I. Orphanage Notes

London To Rome Canoeist To Leave Paris Next Week

(Canadian Press) PARIS, Dec. 9.—Lieut. Gabriel Smythe of Toronto, who is paddling alone in a canoe from London to Rome and who was given a reception by the Paris Rowing Club on December 1, proposes to leave this city next week. He will paddle on the Seine to Saintnemes, just about Melun, then along the Boing Canal. Smythe does not expect to attain a greater speed than 20 miles a day against the current in the Seine River but later hopes to cover 60 miles a day.
