THE North Sydney Herald contains some further particulars about schooner Nutwood which was wrecked at Indian Brook, Victoria Co., during last week's heavy gale. Early Wednesday morning the Nutwood was off Glace Bay harbor, but with an unfavorable wind, and in the midst of a terrific storm Captain Tierney would not risk entering. The Nutwood was then headed for this port which, however, could not be made. By this time the hurricane was blowing, and the vessel was in a perilous position. As a last resort it was decided to beach her if possible. Land was sighted, and the vessel was headed for the breakers. The captain, who was lashed to the wheel ordered the men to the rigging, telling them to look out for themselves when the crash came. Two hours after the vessel struck, one of the sailors volunteered to try and reach the shore with a line. This he fortunately succeeded in doing, and fastened it to a stump. The men, benumbed from their dreadful exposure to the cold blasts, reached shore in safety.
