THE JUDGES.—A turnip competition was held in Truro, recently, at which the judges were Professor M. Cumming, Chas. Hill, and F. L. Fuller, S. J. Moore and H. B. Brown. McIntyre, who was sentenced to serve two years in the penitentiary for stealing \$10,000 from the Bank of Nova Scotia, was taken to Dorchester yesterday in charge of Turnkey Clifford, says a St. John exchange. Two other prisoners, John McGloan and George Adams who have been sentenced to two years each were taken also.

POLICE COURT.—At the Charlottetown Police Court this morning two prohibition cases were tried, the plaintiff in both being Prosecutor Allan Boieser. The cases were that of John Hughes and Pieton C. Brown and each was adjourned until Dec. 11th. Frank Mckerney vs Arthur McDonald on a charge of assault and battery resulted in the defendant being fined \$20 and costs or 60 days imprisonment.

MILD WEATHER.—Two evidences of an unusually open fall were observed at Mount Stewart of late; While some of the local sportsmen was out hunting a week ago, they saw a solitary robin and heard him chirp as cheerily as if it were July. On Friday the people of Mt. Stewart South, were busy at their road-work. The road-master is to be complimented on getting a much needed piece of work done, though so late in the season.—L.

MACKEREL.—The fall catch of mackerel on the Nova Scotia coast is now being marketed. The price paid by export houses averages \$12 per barrel, and the American market for the last week has been decidedly easier; at the moment it is impossible to make sales. Very large shipments to Boston and elsewhere have been made from Cape Breton and Prince Edward Island during the last month, the total quantity shipped being about 3,000 barrels. 11.30

THE PORK MARKET.—This is the time of year when the pork products travellers get in their fine work, says the Halifax Maritime Merchant. Lumbermen and others are buying heavily of barreled pork, and householders generally are consuming tons of sausages. L. A. Putnam, who represents Davis & Fraser in New Brunswick, and John Magowan, who does Cape Breton for the same firm, have been securing an excellent business of late. Mr. Davis tells us they could do more if hogs were in better supply. He thinks it a great pity that the interest in hog raising in the Maritime Provinces is not more keen than it is, and he suggests that country merchants generally should urge each of their customers to raise at least a few more pigs each year.
