EUROPEAN NEWS

PARIS, Oct. 22 (Special)—Among the many reforms introduced by the ex-Socialist, M. Millerand, who has turned out to be the most enterprising Minister of War that this country has had for some years, one is announced as probable, though not yet certain, which will cause some comment in Germany. It is believed French Government will henceforth require that no German officer shall be allowed to enter France through Alsace-Lorraine without a special permit from the French War Office.

PARIS, Oct. 16, (Special)—Two sisters, Louise and Jeanne Dubois, daughters of a respected family residing in the Rue Lecourbe, fought a duel in their bedroom yesterday evening.

Louise, who is only eighteen, had been engaged for some time to a young cabinetmaker.

A little while ago, however, Jeanne fell in love with the young man, and this caused considerable ill-feeling between the sisters.

Yesterday they quarrelled, and from words rapidly came to blows. A desperate struggle followed, and Jeanne had already thrown her adversary to the ground when the latter, seizing a bread-knife, plunged it into her side.

At the sight of her sister lying unconscious and in blood, Louise was overcome with despair, and when the members of the family entered the room they only prevented her by sheer force from stabbing herself to death.

BERLIN, Oct. 16 (Special)—An investigation into the conditions of service for women domestics is at present being carried on by the German Union of Domestic Servants.

Already the research undertaken in 15 towns has revealed that there are conditions such that they call for immediate reform. At the conclusion of the investigation, parliamentary aid will doubtless be invoked to secure the passing of a domestic servants' law similar to the one recently passed in Denmark, under which servants are employed by contract, and the provision of healthy sleeping and working rooms is rigidly enforced.

Owing to the extension of the German National Insurance scheme to employees of private offices, which comes into operation on January 1, 1903, 1,500 new officials are to be created by the Government to deal with this branch of the work, of whom 500 are to be women. These 500 women employees, however, although they will have to pass a Government test of efficiency, are to be discriminated against inasmuch that they will not be considered under the direct employ of the Government, will receive no pension upon retiring and can be discharged at the pleasure of the head of the department. The Commercial Union of Women Employees have entered a vigorous protest against this differentiation of treatment.

PARIS, Oct. 16 (Special)—M. Simonnet, a pork butcher, had a very pretty wife named Regina. Madame Simonnet, preferred the post of cashier in a fashionable grocer's shop in the Avenue Friedland.

The shop in which Madame Simonnet is employed closes at seven, as her husband's very well new, but it was always close on midnight when the lady returned to her home in Neuilly-sur-Seine. She showed con-

siderable ingenuity in explaining away the lateness of her return. These excuses did not long satisfy the jealous pork butcher. He decided to clear things up, and before seven o'clock one evening he posted himself opposite the shop where his wife worked. On the stroke of seven he saw the lady leaving, but not unaccompanied. She was clinging to the arm of a very elegant gentleman, the grocer's foreman, in fact.

M. Simonnet faced the couple and challenged his rival to a duel. Unfortunately, neither M. Simonnet nor his rival was sufficiently cognizant of the polite formulae of exchanging cards and witnesses. They cut the cackle and came to the Browning, which, needless to say, both had handy in their hip-pockets. Several shots were exchanged and both revolvers emptied before the spectators, who kept at a safe distance, felt it incumbent on them to interfere. M. Simonnet, already the injured party, was struck in the right leg and the left side.

The wounded duellist was pretty severely handled before the police took him in charge and to the hospital. The grocer's foreman had in the meantime been arrested. Regina who had been grazed by a bullet while attempting to throw herself between lover and husband, was carried in an effective faint to the nearest chemist's, where she soon recovered. M. Simonnet is in no serious danger. The grocer's foreman, who pleaded "legitimate defence," remains at the police station.
