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MORE LIBERALS ARE JOINING BORDEN

Hon. W. S. Fielding Decides for Union Government and Will Contest Yarmouth, N.S., as Supporter of Borden. Only Two Western Liberals Remain to Support Laurier.

OTTAWA, Oct. 24.—Hon. W. S. Fielding, former Minister of Finance in Sir Wilfrid Laurier's government, has declared for Union Government, and it is understood will contest Yarmouth, N. S., as a supporter of Sir Robert Borden's government.

Mr. Fielding will announce the date of the election next week. He will open the campaign in Halifax and it is understood that Hon. N. W. Rowell, Hon. Arthur Meighen, Hon. F. B. Carvell and Hon. A. K. MacLean will be present in the opening meeting.

HON. W. S. FIELDING ENDORSES UNION GOVT.

IRISH REBEL ARRESTED AT HALIFAX

NEW YORK, Oct. 24.—Dr. Patrick MacCarton, Sinn Feiner, arrested by the British authorities at Halifax, agreed with "General" Liam Mellowes, one of the leaders of the 1916 rebellion in Ireland, that they would attempt to get back to Ireland, and it is possible presumably in so far as MacCarton was concerned to further agitate and foment another Sinn Fein Rebellion in Ireland. The Military authorities at Halifax took MacCarton off a ship.

WHOLE WESTERN GERMAN LINE IS NOW SERIOUSLY THREATENED

The French Continue to Rain Annihilating Blows on the German Positions. 8,000 Prisoners Have Already Been Counted, Many Guns Taken and Several Villages. All German Counter-Attacks Were Repulsed. 160 Officers Belonging to Eight Different Divisions are Among the Prisoners.

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The Germans attempted no counter-attack on the Aisne battlefield during the night. In the Verdun sector the Germans made a violent attack on the French position north of Hill 344, but were beaten back by the French. The announcement follows:

EARLIER REPORTS OF GREAT DRIVE

PARIS, Oct. 24.—In one of the swiftest and most crushing blows of the war, the French troops to-day smashed through the German lines at one point, inflicted heavy losses on the enemy and captured more than 7,500 prisoners and 25 heavy guns and field guns. Several important villages also fell into the hands of the French, according to the War Office announcement last night.

PREMIER KERENSKY WILL RESIGN COMMAND

Several munition factories were wrecked in recent food riots in Vienna, Pressburg, Brunnau, and Lalsbach, the rioters being mostly women, the advice states. The police, according to the reports, fired on the crowds, killing and wounding many persons.
