### HARRIMAN MERGER DISSOLUTION PLAN.

NEW YORK, Feb. 6.—Plans for the dissolution of the Union Pacific Railroad Company as decreed by the United States supreme court, were officially announced in detail tonight after a protracted session of the directors of the two companies.

The terms are said, in a statement issued jointly by the roads, to have the approval of the department of justice at Ottawa and the agreement now awaits confirmation of the court in the federal district, where action was originally taken, and by the railroad commission of the State of California, in accordance with recent intimations the severance of Union Pacific routes in the Central Pacific, which has been the bone of contention between the two principal roads of the Harriman system.

The agreement also provides for the sale of all the Southern Pacific stock held by the Union Pacific at 98 per cent, with accrued dividend to the stockholders, common and preferred of the Union Pacific and Southern Pacific other than the Union Pacific and Oregon short line. It is understood that a syndicate has been formed under the lead of Kuhn Loeb & Company and their foreign connections to finance the sale of Union Pacific's holdings of Southern Pacific, amounting to \$120,650,000.

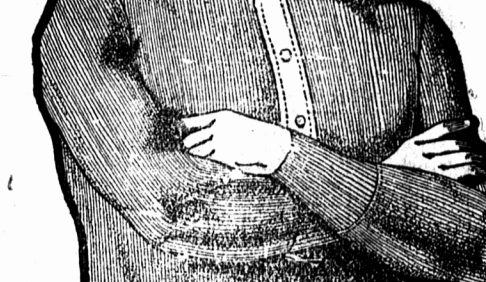
