PITTSBURGH, Pa., March 13--Two paymasters of coal companies were held up yesterday in different sections of Eastern Ohio and robbed of sums approximating \$5,600.

Edward McGann, paymaster of the Dexter Coal Company, and Robert Pommering, an assistant, left this city for the mine of the company at Brilliant, Ohio. They carried in a satchel \$4,000, the weekly pay of the miners.

Hardly had the excitement quieted when another hold-up was reported from Zanesville. George Evans, aged 50, paymaster of the Muskingum Coal Company, was shot from ambush at Bueeye, near Zanesville, and died last night.

VANCOUVER, B. C., March 12--After dodging another snowslide, which all but nipped them, the coroner's jury chosen to investigate the Rogers Pass slide, returned to Revelstoke yesterday.

Foreman McDonald, of Sydney, C. B., one of the victims of the slide, was an exceptionally heavy and strong man, and, after being buried in the slide, he evidently retained enough consciousness to start to fight his way to the surface.

An avalanche descended at Field yesterday and engulfed a switch engine. Engineer Howard McRae and Fireman Lauderman escaped, and Foreman Lainprize was buried but rescued. His leg was broken.

\$16,600 LIQUOR SALE FINE.

SPARTANBURG, S. C., March 13--Mayor J. B. Lee, in the police court here today, sentenced George Dearman to pay a fine of \$16,600 or serve 14 years on the city chain gang for violation of the liquor ordinance.

Dearman's house was raided last night by the police and about 40 gallons of whiskey put up in small bottles seized. The Mayor made separate case for each bottle and imposed a fine of \$100 or 30 days in each.

PEOPLE IN PORTLAND HOTEL GET A SCARE.

PORTLAND, Me., March 13--Two hundred people were driven from their beds into the hotel office, when a fire in a corner of the Hotel Falmouth block at 216 Middle Street, threatened the entire structure early this morning.

The flames did damage which will not exceed \$15,000, and were confined to the store of York & Boothby, electrical contractors.

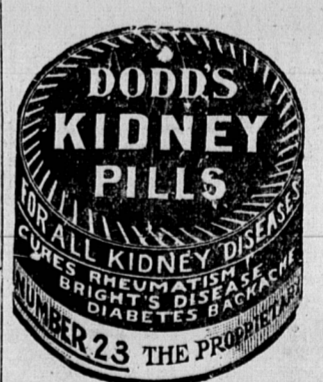
