Inclusion of U. S. Fishermen
(Special to the Guardian)
OTTAWA, May 10.—The Government is considering the exclusion of the United States fishermen from using Pacific Coast ports as a base of supply for their operations. A similar privilege of the Atlantic was abolished two years ago and for some months there has been an industrial agitation among the North Pacific fishermen to extend the prohibition barring entry to the ports save for shelter, wood, water or repairs. The argument is that while the United States duty practically excludes Canadian fish from the markets across the line, it is unfair to use Canadian ports as a base of a business in the benefits of which Canadians cannot share.
