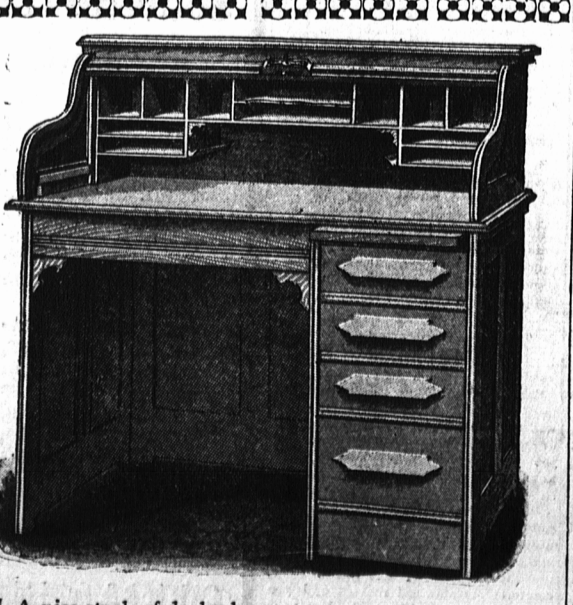

THE BILL OF DAMAGES.

Many people are asking whether or not the Local Government when at Ottawa in delegation, or before or after, presented the claim against the Federal Government for non-fulfillment of contract as to communication for the years since the last settlement.

"Resolved that the Provincial Government be and is hereby requested to urge incessantly on the Federal Government the absolute necessity of implementing the terms of confederation, and further resolved that our claims for compensation, for the non-fulfillment of such terms be yearly served upon the Federal authorities."

So far there has been no quite adequate report made of the Provincial Government delegation and therefore we do not know with certainty what was done and what was left undone beyond presenting the memorial adopted by the Legislature.

We would like to know whether our claim and for what amount has been presented, and what answer if any has been received. We see no reason why full information on this point should not be at once supplied to the people.
