SATURDAY'S YACHT RACE WON BY THE GHOST

The Yachting Season Opened On Saturday, Good Race Over Short Course For A Starter.

The Charlottetown Yacht Club Minniego had gained a half minute held the first race of the season over the short course on Saturday afternoon.

Only four boats were trimmed and ready for the starter on Saturday, but more are being overhauled and getting in shape for the season and will be out shortly. Great interest is being taken in the boats this season and this interest is due to increase when the boats have a few more turns around the harbor.

In Saturday's race there were only four yachts to come out, P-no, Messrs Art Campbell and John King, Minniego, Messrs Gordon Essory and Chester Acora, Ghost, Messrs John Lund and E. Smith, Zenith, Messrs Malcolm Irwin, Ernest McInnis and Alfred Head.

The boats got away at 2:48 the Minniego crossing the line first, followed by the Ghost, Zenith and P-no, the latter getting away to a bad start.

At 3:02 the Ghost rounded the Roseneath buoy, followed by Minniego, P-no and Zenith.

From this the three leading boats increased their lead over the Zenith rounding the Park buoy at 3:10, the Ghost leading, with the Minniego and P-no closing in and the Zenith about three minutes behind.

At 3:17 the Ghost rounded the stake boat starting on the second lay. The Minniego a half minute behind and the P-no one minute behind, Zenith three minutes.

At Roseneath the three leading boats closed in and rounded almost together. One quarter of a second separating the three boats.

On the run to the Park buoy and Ghost opened the gap a little and got around three quarters of a minute ahead of the Minniego and P-no a quarter of a minute after the latter, Zenith last.

At the stake boat going into the last lay, the Ghost had one minute on the Minniego and P-no who rounded together, Zenith losing a little on the run down.

On the run to the Park the Ghost practically clinched the race widening the gap to nearly a minute ahead of the Minniego rounding the buoy at 4:06, the P-no coming to within striking distance of the Minniego, the Zenith following back to eight minutes behind the leading boat.

At the finish the Ghost had increased her lead on the home stretch of a minute and a half finishing at 4:14-1/2, the P-no nosed out the Minniego at the line 4:16, the Minniego at 4:16-1/5 and the Zenith at 4:23. The time of the race one hour twenty-six and a half minutes. The officials of the race were:

Starters—Messrs Frank McDonald, and Hal Bourke.
Judges—Messrs J. F. Brogg, John Webster and John Hearn.

The judges were taken in Mr. John Hearn's motor launch Elinor.

French Reinforcements Going To China

LONDON, June 4.—Reuters Pekin correspondent says that the legation defence force will be commanded by Colonel Little, U.S. A. It is reported unofficially, but reliably, he adds that Japan will shortly send a brigade to Tientsin and a battalion each to Pekin, China, Wangtiao and Shanhaikwao. Two more French companies are expected at Pekin at an early date from Tientsin, increasing the French force from 400 to 500 men.

The first battalion of reinforcements from France is due at Tientsin June 14, the second about July 2nd. Two additional battalions are expected from France in the near future.
