RECRUITING MEETING AT CORNWALL.—A very large and enthusiastic recruiting meeting was held in the Hall at Cornwall on Tuesday evening. As a result of the meeting two young men came forward to the platform and signed the roll of honour, and quite a number of others have promised to join within the next few days. The enthusiasm of the meeting was in great part due to the patriotic songs so splendidly rendered by Professor Barlow and also those given by Gunners Hichie and Williams. Professor Thompson of the First Methodist Church was the accompanist, and nothing need be said regarding his efforts.
