(CP) — The Union Nationale victory in Quebec clearly indicates a swing away from the Liberals and forecasts strong support for the Progressive Conservative Party in the Federal campaign, P. D. McArthur, National President of the Progressive Conservative Party, said today in commenting on the Quebec election.

"The Alberta result, too, is all to the good," Mr. McArthur said. "It is a proof that the C.P. is not nearly as powerful as had generally been supposed."

SPICED RED CURRANTS

3 pounds red currants
6 cups of sugar
1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
1 1/2 teaspoons ground cloves

1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper
1 cup vinegar

Prepare the red currants by washing them thoroughly and removing stems.
Mix the sugar, cinnamon, cloves, salt and pepper thoroughly in a greased preserving kettle. Stir in the vinegar and the red currants.
Bring to the boil, stirring constantly until sugar is dissolved and cook uncovered, with frequent stirring, until thick—about 30 minutes. Skim.
Turn into hot sterilized glasses. Seal and label.

New York Yankees ended the Houston winning streak of the American League-leading Browns by smashing out a 6-1 victory over St. Louis before 8,253 fans at New York yesterday.

Veteran Atley Donald limited Luke Sawell's men to eight scattered hits as he registered his 12th victory of the year and his third over the Browns this season against two defeats.

The Yankees garnered 13 hits off the combined offerings of Sigmund (Jack) Jakucki, Al Hollingsworth and Sam Zolack, with Jakucki charged with the defeat, his seventh against 10 victims.

At Chicago the White Sox defeated Boston Red Sox 9-7 when pitcher Clem Hausmann walked home the winning run with the score tied at 7-all and two out in the ninth inning.

George (Pinky) Woods, who relieved Hausmann, still with the bases loaded, then walked the next man and Chicago had its nine runs.

Chicago chalked up its first triumph in Fenway Park this season and took the third victory at games. The victory went to pitcher the expense of the Red Sox in 17 Red Sox.

Urges Education Be Considered

QUEBEC, Aug. 10. (CP) — Dr. E. F. Willoughby of Winnipeg, vice-president of the Canadian Teachers' Federation, said tonight that "education has not occupied its rightful place in the life of our nation" and urged that the federal and provincial governments see that the youth of the country be taught "the ideals and principles of democracy."

Dr. Willoughby spoke over a CBC network and is attending the 23rd annual meeting of the Federation at Montmorency Falls.

Dr. Willoughby said that "the doubling of the annual expenditure on education in this country is necessary but obviously cannot be done in most provinces on the present basis of taxation."

"The British North America Act gave the provinces autonomy in educational matters," he added and grants to the provinces should be made by the Federal Government "without interference with provincial autonomy in educational matters."

Drew Comments On Senate Criticism

TORONTO, Aug. 10. (CP) — Criticism in the senate of the speech opposing the family allowance bill is "hardly worth bothering about," Premier Drew of Ontario said tonight.

He was criticized in senate speeches by Senator A. K. Hughes, Quebec Liberal, and Senator James Murdoch, Ontario Liberal.

"Their speeches unfortunately explain only too clearly why so many people in Canada have the very wrong impression that the Senate is composed of senile old men," the Premier said in an interview. "I need only point out that not one word was heard from either of them while seditious speeches were being made in many parts of Quebec and the soldiers and people of Britain were being held up to contempt and ridicule. That was the time for them to speak up if they had anything worth saying and really cared at all about national unity."
