A DARING CRIME IN NEW YORK CITY

Man Sandbagged on a Street Car... Robbed and Nearly Killed on Herald Square... Outrage Committed in Sight of Policeman.

New York, Dec. 10.—A most daring hold-up was recently committed in the heart of New York, on a Broadway street, just as it was passing Herald Square. The car was well filled. In a rear corner stood a policeman. The crime was brilliantly lighted. It seems strange that a man could be sandbagged and nearly killed under these conditions, yet that is exactly what did occur. The victim was Michael Connolly, a produce dealer. The car was moving when he got on and he found four men on the rear platform. He was smoking a cigar so he did not join this "wife and child" in the car. The conductor, William Kennedy, was sitting in the front of the car. Connolly threw away his cigar and started to join his party. The man blocked his way. As he started to shove him forward one of them threw his arms over his shoulders, and held him fast. Connolly is a large man, very strong and fearless. "I realized at once," he said, "that I was being held up. The car was at 44th street and Broadway. There were plenty of persons on the sidewalk; there were 25 or more persons in the car. Herald Square was brightly lighted, and there was even reason for a citizen to feel that he was reasonably safe from the lawless. But the man pulled a gun and shot at me and the other three were jumping me and cutting my pockets."

PUT UP A FIGHT. "I threw off the man who was holding me. He fell in the car and I fell on top of him. I had him face down against the ceiling, but another highwayman seized me by the back of the collar and twisted it in an effort to choke me. Then some one hit me on the back of the head with a blackjack and I lost consciousness. Mr. McAdam saw the first man attacking his brother-in-law. He jumped from his seat and said: "Robbery! The conductor or a copped collector force and looked back. The police station was empty. The women screamed and McAdam and the conductor ran to the back platform and jumped to the street. The last of the four men hurried away as McAdam and the conductor ran to where Connolly lay. McAdam yielded for the police but there was no answer. "We carried Mr. Connolly into a drug store at the corner," Mr. McAdam said, "and then we sent messengers to hunt for the police. Finally, in about fifteen minutes a policeman appeared. "When I came to," Mr. Connolly said, "one of the first persons in the crowd in the drug store that I recognized was one of the four highwaymen. He had evidently come in to hear what I would say to the police. He had plenty of nerve, I think. I was too ill to point him out. I was ed to, but when a man has been hit on the base of the skull with a blackjack he can't do much thinking or offer much aid to the police. "I only had \$35 with me," Mr. Connolly

said, "but they took it all quickly enough. Then they took my coat and plain I think at the moment I was following me, I think at least a large sum of money with me. I can't believe that four men would run the chance of a long prison term for \$35 and a few watch and chain. It is thought that the thieves may be from Pittsburg, as the police say no New York robber would have dared to kidnap a citizen in a Broadway car in Herald Square with a broadsword and two patrol men standing on the next corner."
