ROYAL YEAST

Voices Are Growing Deeper
Nowadays there is a noticeable stir in musical centres when a new tenor or soprano is discovered. A baritone or contralto voice, on the other hand, however beautiful may be its quality, attracts but little notice.

All the great masters agree that sopranos are becoming more and more difficult to find, and so rare is a pure tenor that the possession of such a voice has been called a disease.

The reason for this is that with each successive generation the human voice has become a shade deeper. A genuine bass voice was unknown among our more remote ancestors, and most of their carolling was in what would nowadays be called falsetto tones.

Baritone voices are the most common among masculine singers of today, and even these are distinctly a shade deeper in tone than the baritones of fifty years ago.

The English opera could never be sustained by the voices of her countrymen, and it is to the southern climes we must look for the slowly but surely dying "fute" voice.

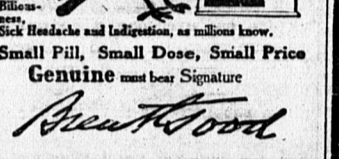
Umbrellas of Ancient Origin

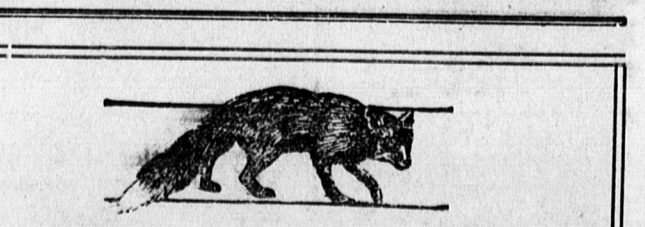
