CLOSING STOCK LETTER.

New York — The market in the early part of the afternoon showed a firm degree of firmness but its strength was more theoretical than real and under the rumor which seemed to have gained general currency that the steel Trust would in the light of president Taft's speech, dissolve voluntarily, prices very quickly responded to the talk which was in steel that there was the most marked absence of rallying power and the heaviness of the preferred stock and collateral trust fixes to confirm at least to the trading element the talk about its dissolution. The fact nevertheless remains however that the decline in steel to 62 1/2 at which price the stock with its 5 p. c. dividend yields nearly 8 p. c. in the investment, certainly must indicate a reduction in the dividend rate and the stock shows a loss of nearly 17 points from the high point of July, which would appear however that the market was apparently oversold in the last hour as the result of vigorous bear demonstrations and the covering of shorts on a fairly large scale as noted all round the room. This covering caused upturns ranging from fractions to over one point and gave the market a firmer appearance in the final dealings. Lehigh Valley, Erie and St. Paul were among the issues that closed with net gains for the day. Total sales 746,160; Bonds \$2,223,000.

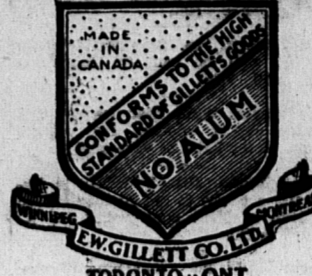
