BOX CAMERA CAN 'SHOOT' THE STARS WITH SUCCESS

Any boy or girl can take interesting pictures of the stars without using expensive lenses and plates. With any camera the apparent motion of the constellations around Polaris, the pole star in the handle of the Little Dipper, may be shown.

Fasten a box or folding camera to a board and prop it up with blocks until the lens points to the pole star in the northern heavens. Open the diaphragm to its largest opening and you are ready to take your picture. If possible use a tripod to hold the camera in its position. Open the shutter and without moving the camera make an exposure of a few hours. The shutter is then closed and the film developed.

The finished print will contain a series of fine white lines forming concentric arcs which show the motion of the stars from east to west as the earth revolves. More stars will be recorded if very sensitive panchromatic film is used. Occasionally a meteor, or two will leave an arrow-like trace across the negative. This is the ordinary "shooting star," several of which may be seen on any clear, starry night. A comet of meteor is the "fire ball," a huge "falling star" getting its name from its appearance. These often explode and cast a shadow of brilliant sparks over the sky. Only once was one of these objects ever photographed. It was the amateur astronomer with a cheap box camera who obtained the only picture of a fire ball in existence.
